1. Students must take 30-34 credits of essential skills courses.
2. Students must take at least 1 math course.
3. Students must take Composition I.
4. Students must take one Basic level (B) and one Intermediate level (I) course for each skill. B level courses build the skill. I level expects a working knowledge of the skill.
5. Student must take a total of 15 credits of B level and 15 credits of I level coursework.
6. Students must fulfill the skills requirement by taking courses in at least 4 of the 6 content areas.
