Course Placement – ENGL 111G and math/statistics require placement based on ACT score and HS GPA. If you do not place into these courses, a prerequisite may be required. You can take the Math Placement Exam to attempt to improve your placement in Math and/or Statistics.

Area I – Ag & Comm Development requires AXED 201G to satisfy Area I C. All other majors represented under this Meta major can choose any course listed under Area I C.

Area II – A ST 251G or STAT 251G is a requirement for Hotel, Restaurant & Tourism Management while Clothing, Textile & Fashion Merchandising requires MATH 210G. MATH 121G fulfills the General Education Math requirement for all remaining majors represented by this Meta Major. For math/statistics alternatives, please see your advisor.

Area III – Ag & Comm Development requires BIOL 111G/L and HORT 100 while Clothing, Textile & Fashion Merchandising requires CHEM 110G. All other majors represented under this Meta major can choose any course listed under Area III.

Area IV – Computer Science (BA) may choose any course under Area IV. Ag & Comm Development prefers AG E 210G while Clothing, Textile & Fashion Merchandising requires SOC 101G. All other majors represented under this Meta Major choose ECON 251G or ECON 252G.

Area V – in Term 1, If you are interested in Ag & Comm Development choose HIST 201G or HIST 202G. Choose Art 101G or ART 110 if you are interested in Clothing, Textile & Fashion Merchandising. All other majors represented by this Meta Major can choose any course listed under Area V. In **Term 2**, Choose any course listed under Area V.
